Middle School Story-Based Lesson

Book or literature to be used: *Island of the Blue Dolphins* by Scott O'Dell

What the teacher will do	Materials to present	What the student will do	Examples of student responses
Read the author (e.g., "The author of this story is named Scott O'Dell. Can you find the author?").	Text point to author of book while labeling it as "author."	Point to author.	Eye gaze word for word, point
Ask, "How do we get started?"	Present the book upside down and backward.	Open book to first page.	Reorient book and open, activate VOCA to request open
Read text and provide students chance to turn page.	Text point along with reading and pauses at end of page (e.g., "How do we keep the story going?").	Turn pages when appropriate.	Turn page, look at picture/symbol, or activate VOCA
Pause for repeated story line.	Read up to repeated story line or half of repeated story line (e.g., "What will happen to...").	Anticipate repeated story line or finish repeated story line.	Say story line or activate switch
